## Halving a Blast

In a perhaps misguided fit of austerity, this puzzle was written for a *couple* of gatherings, one at a Mystery-Hunt-adjacent pub and one at a park where puzzle gatherings happen; both are on a certain street. It may seem perilous for the Lamplighter and Powderhouse to be put together in this manner; in the grid, eight "special" squares must each get a letter *pair* from one entry and a different letter pair from the other crossing entry, and these pairs will combine to illustrate that peril.

Fortunately, something is different in the two cases, which will be named by the left-hand and right-hand columns in the filled grid. Of the clues whose answers do *not* go through a special square, all but four have an extra letter a—i (to be deleted before solving) at some word's left or right end; look in the left-hand or right-hand column (respectively), in the row indicated by the extra letter, and write the letter in that square next to the clue. Then:

- A. The letters next to Across clues will (in clue order) give words saying what the two kinds of gathering are.
- B. For each of the four other clues, the entry will be either (i) something like the answer that is appropriate for the first A word, or (ii) something like the second A word that is appropriate for the answer.
- C. The letters next to Down clues will (in clue order) give a word describing the rather scant offerings of B, or two words describing what (in a certain code) the special squares form. If you want, you can counteract the austerity of this puzzle, making it *slightly* more festive, by coloring in all the special squares in the appropriate way.
