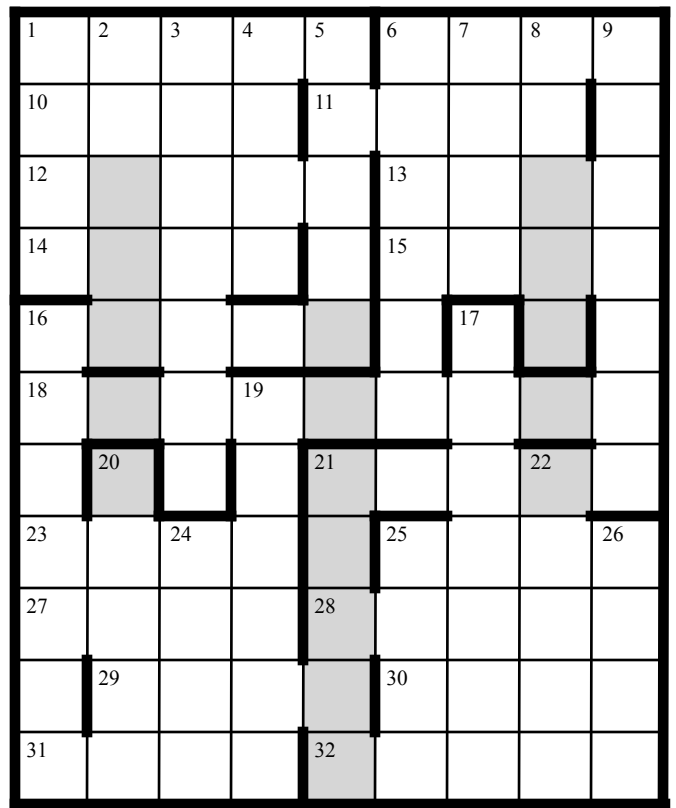


Dinner Towards 7:00 by Ucaoimhu

Friendsgiving dishes can be even more memorable if moved south and west. In the filled grid, each gray area will contain a word; if (left to right) these are α , β , and γ , then $\alpha \beta$ and γ are the results of moving two such dishes south-southwest. Then:

1. Fifteen clues each contain one letter, which must be corrected before solving; in clue order, the incorrect letters will name objects that α and γ both have, which can be fancifully called β because they do what the correct letters say.
2. Ten other clue answers intersect five “special” squares, and each is entered with a letter *pair* in the special square; the two pairs in a given special square will disagree. Take the special squares column by column, left to right, in the grid. Connected dot-to-dot in this order, they will depict either object from 1; the five pairs from Across answers and the five pairs from Down answers will each, in this order, name the VIP who gave the world those objects.
3. The other twelve clues each have wordplay yielding a *character* sequence with one incorrect *character*; write the correct character and then the incorrect character next to the clue. These pairs, in clue order, will say what much-appreciated subset of γ ’s pre-move version 2’s VIP (under his Down-answer name) might also supply.
